Francine Leng completed a bachelor's degree with Jacinthe Couture and a master's degree in piano performance at the Université de Montréal with Gilles Manny. She then obtained a Diplôme d'études spécialisées en duo-pianos under the direction of Jean-Eudes Vaillancourt. She also took advanced courses with André Laplante, Menahem Pressler and György Sebök.

At 13, she was soloist with the Orchestre des Jeunes de Sherbrooke.

Winner of the Canadian Music Competition on several occasions, **in 1996 she won the Académie de musique canadienne prize at the prestigious Prix d'Europe.**

Since 2005, Francine Leng has been pianist-accompanist for the music departments of the Cégep de Sherbrooke and Bishop's University in Lennoxville. She also coaches the Sherbrooke Symphony Choir. Very active on the music scene, she is a regular accompanist at competitions and concerts in the region. She teaches piano at the Mitchell School and privately.
